## **2018 FLU CAMPAIGN**



We are managing the 2018 flu campaign differently to previous years. This is due to delivery schedules and different vaccines for different age groups.

The following groups of people are eligible for a flu vaccination:

Aged 65 or over

If you have a diagnosis of:

- chronic liver disease
- diabetes
- asthma
- chronic airways disease (COPD)
- heart disease
- Parkinson's disease
- Multiple Sclerosis
- HIV / AIDs

You are also eligible for a flu jab if you are **pregnant**, if you are a **carer** for another person, if you have had your spleen removed, if you are undergoing chemotherapy, if you are overweight (BMI over 40) or if you are on regular treatment with **steroids**.

#### **SIGNPOSTING**

It has been practice policy for some time now for our admin team to 'triage' all same day appointment requests. We have worked very hard to train our nurses to treat minor ailments and were very lucky to welcome Caroline (our Advanced Nurse Practitioner) to the team.

When you contact us to request an appointment your request is triaged so you are booked in with the most relevant clinician.

In addition to the current triage system, the CCG have worked with all local practices to develop a 'Signposting' service. If you contact the surgery with a condition that can potentially be treated by a more appropriate service, you will be 'signposted' to that service. For example if you contact us with an eye problem, you will be asked questions about the problem and may be asked to attend an optician.
